Tues, Weds, Thurs - Sessions 1, 2, 5, 6, 9, 10, 11, 12

Dr Michael Evans - The Physical Expression of the Human I - Observation of Human and Animal Skeleton

Tues, Weds - Sessions 3, 4, 7, 8

Vivian Gladwell - Clowning is a state of playfulness - that brings us to experience a child-like, naïve and vulnerable state of being. Paradoxically we grow, learn and are strengthened through reconnecting playfully with what makes us most vulnerable.

Tues, Weds, Thurs - Sessions 3,4,7,8,11,12

John Meeks - Are the Ancient Myths of the Stars and Planets Still Relevant Today? A deeper exploration of the ancient stellar myths can show that they are not only eloquent in themselves, but have the potential to awaken a new perception of the cosmos and of our own place within it.

Tues, Weds, Thurs - Sessions 4, 8, 12

Dr Kenneth Gibson - Extracts from Life - Explorations in Human Biography. This workshop will explore biographical extracts from individuals in literature, history and culture. This will prepare us to investigate and eventually write our own 'extracts from life' through various activities such as conversation, group work and sharing.

Tues, Weds, Thurs - Sessions 3, 4, 7, 8, 11, 12

Annie Blampied-Radojcin - A Wonderful Urgency - The only thing we know for sure about our future, is that one day, we will die. By facing this truth open heartedly, we can welcome our fears, and thus release them. We can think about where we are going across the Threshold and thus discover the paradox of being able to live our daily life with more contentment and fulfilment. In these three days, we will consider our mortality in practical, spiritual and artistic ways, remembering the support of our angels in all we do.

Tues, Weds, Thurs - Sessions 1, 2, 5, 6, 9, 10

Daniel Docherty - The Golden Ratio - Holding the theme of the gathering in mind, we will take a philosophical and practical journey into the timeless mysteries of the Golden Ratio. This 'Divine Proportion' teaches us that future, past and present can potentially be held in exquisite harmony and beauty. It is a practice of building meaningful relationships; a vital practice in these fractious times. The focus of our explorations will revolve around the construction and painting of golden mandalas, gently led by Daniel Docherty in the warm space of Sacred Art of Geometry Studios.

Paul Matthews - Writing Creatively Together - loving words, permitting fantasy, attending to each other. Whose word could be truthful enough for the Stone to accept it? Who could have beauty enough to speak for the Rose? Who could be innocent enough to utter what's at the heart of a wolf or a goldfish? Who could be grounded in love enough to sound what is most deeply human? It could be you.

Mary-Anne Paterson - A Mystery of Art - All art, Steiner said, originated in the mysteries of Hibernia. Artistic impulse has to permeate all knowledge, all education; and, in its essence, as imagination, must also permeate social and economic life

In late summer 1923, following his encounters with megalithic pre-history Druid sanctuaries at Penmaenmawr Ilkley and Anglesey and giving his unique series 'lectures to the British' Rudolf Steiner then founded in London The Anthroposophical Society in G.B.

Returning inspired with a renewed energy to Dornach, he made a large drawing in pastel 'The Druid Stone Sketch' which he later gifted to Ita Wegman. Celebrating its Centenary and bridging into the new, we will work with pastels and healing plant colours to create our own understanding of this Art work.

Fri - Sessions 9, 10, 11, 12

Roi Gal-Or - Only time will tell - Through the eyes of European, Western culture, it seems that the privileged and comfortable story it has been living has arrived at a point in time when old structures and long-held certainties are collapsing.

Where do we go from here? What is the future asking of us?

In this workshop, through thought-provoking and playful exercises we will open spaces for meaningful and honest conversations, exploring ways of navigating creatively through the uncomfortable uncertainties of these times. We will be turning to stories, the great companions, teachers and shifters of humanity for wisdom, new images and inspiration.
